Emma Frankland is an award winning live performance and theatre artist. For the past 5 years her practice has focused on politically motivated performances surrounding issues of gender and identity (relating to her own experience as a trans woman). Her work often focuses on honesty, action & a playfully destructive DIY aesthetic. She uses materials with different transformative properties – such as water, clay, earth, salt and ink – to create strong visual imagery which is often messy, intense and celebratory.

In recent years, her work has been focussed on the None of Us is Yet a Robot project, a series of performance pieces exploring gender, trans identity and the politics of transition.

In 2013 she was a featured artist at the British Council Showcase and since then has performed in São Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Jakarta, Toronto and across the UK & Europe. As a performer and dramaturg she has collaborated with many companies including WildWorks, Chris Goode & Company, Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, Stratford Festival (ON), Theatre Royal Stratford East and for BBC radio drama and television.
